Prepare a Way... The Way

A procession of palms; a parade of 'hosannas'-turned- chorus of 'crucify him.' In between, there's a solemn but significant meal in an upper room, followed by a moonlit prayer in the ominous shadows of an olive grove. And then the unthinkable on Friday—that bloody cross and a flagellated Christ weaving their way through the Via Dolorosa to the Place of the Skull (Golgotha) and then, two days later, the early morning darkness on Sunday.

At first blush, the events of Holy Week seem so heavy and other-worldly. If we're not careful, we can pigeonhole ourselves into a role akin to mere spectators, staring from cozy balcony seats, gawking at some far away scene for which we play no real part in the story. It's an appealing posture to assume, for sure. It's sanitary and safe, but it isn't realistic. No, it's much riskier than that. Rewind and look a little closer:

"[Jesus] sent two of the disciples saying, 'Go into the village ahead of you...untie the colt...and bring it here. (Lk. 19:29)

"Go into the city to a certain man and say to him, 'The Teacher says My time is near; I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples.' So the disciples did...and they prepared the Passover meal." (Matt. 26:17)

Later in the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus said to them, "Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial." (Matt. 26:41)

"As they led Jesus away, they seized a man, Simon of Cyrene...and they laid the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus." (Lk. 23:26).

"Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb." (Jn 20:1)

Could you track a trend? Indeed, it's a minor detail we conveniently crop out of the Easter picture:

The preparations of people always seem to preempt the power of God.

Don't miss this: The divine trappings of Holy Week are curiously, yet splendidly woven into human movements that are hopelessly habitual:

"Go ahead of me—untie and bring. Go, prepare, stay awake, and pray. Pick up a cross and follow.

Get up, commit to walk while it's still dark. Despite the grit, go ahead and go anyways."

We're not called as ones who stand on the sidelines and spectate. We're called to pick up a cross and follow, to walk while it's still dark. Why? Because Easter isn't a day, it's our *identity*...and we know Who *shows up* when we *go ahead* in faith. Disciples of Jesus are never sent alone. Won't you go ahead and join us?

Lets go. Prepare away. Prepare a way for The Way.

Christ UMC Family,

As of March 1st, it is with great excitement that I share Diann Nickerson's joining Christ UMC as the full time Family Life Coordinator and Director of Campus Ministries! If you can recall, shortly after 2020, with the extravagant generosity of the late Allen Green, a vision team was assembled and we diligently interviewed, brainstormed, and planned with various groups and teams within the church. After about a 12 month span, one consistent theme that kept surfacing relative to a need to sustain and drive generative ministries in the future was this very position.



As you might imagine, it was challenging to develop much traction and traffic with the position, especially in the throes of a pandemic. Despite the enthusi-

asm and energy that accompanied the notion of adding a staff position like this one, we didn't rush into anything hastily; we explored numerous digital employment platforms and after almost 3 years, our patience paid off, when in January we began conversations with Diann. I fully believe God's fingerprints are all over this, and while I'm sure she'll add more details regarding the circumstances surrounding her hire, I want to take this time to share why I'm absolutely thrilled (as you should be) about what this means for Christ UMC and the wider Ohio Valley:

It means a number of vital ministries that have been established at West Liberty University (WLU) can not only continue, but it also provides us a wide open window to create a deliberate bridge from the local church to campus life enroute to new, fresh and intergenerational expressions of church that are largely absent in the communal life of congregations in general. Further, it also means that Christ Church could potentially become a connectional hub, cross-pollinating students of Wheeling University, WLU and members of this congregation in missionally vital ways that weren't realized before. The possibilities in this area are endless.

It also means that Diann and I will consistently collaborate in brainstorming, planning and creating a robust teaching/education program that will effectively overlap sermonic themes with children's lessons. We want families within this church equipped to read the scriptures and grow together with the ability to go home on Sunday mornings talking about the same things. To that end, we will work together to cultivate spaces for families within the church (especially those with little ones) to study, dialogue, fellowship, do life and serve together. Oftentimes parents of younger children hunger for such spaces, but concerns related to childcare unfortunately serve as stumbling blocks. But imagine a space where two adults can join others for spiritual growth and discipleship while your kids do the same thing? That's exciting!

The human heart longs to be in community. We long for a space to live, serve and grow together. I look forward to fostering a space where families can not only receive the word of God, but to take advantage of planned opportunities to enflesh it in mission together—kids, families and college students at once!

Join me in celebrating and welcoming Diann. She will be an asset to this congregation, collegiate life and the wider community. I look with joy and eager anticipation as each us pursues a deeper path of discipleship that results in us loving and looking like Jesus more than we did the day before!

Hello! I'm the new Family Life Coordinator and Director of Campus Ministries at Christ United Methodist Church and I'm delighted to be here and would like to share a little bit of my story.

I come to you from West Liberty University where I began working in Campus Ministry in August of 2021. I work with students across campus helping them to connect with their faith by providing learning and service opportunities. We make these connections by having a weekly bible study, worship services, along with volunteer opportunities and experiential learning weekends.

In November 2023 Campus Ministers across the WV Annual Conference were informed the Annual Conference would no longer provide funding for the campus pastors. We were told the work of campus ministry didn't have to stop but that the Annual Conference would no longer be able to support it financially as it had in the past. I began praying God would help us find a way forward, pointing us to a new path.

So, I had to start looking for a job! A few weeks before Christmas I was listening to the rebroadcast of your online worship service, and I noticed during the announcement portion of the service the church was looking for a Christian Education/Family Life Coordinator. See the importance of reading your bulletin and watching the announcements **before** the service begins?!! Pastor Jake and I met to discuss the position and how it might be able to include an aspect of Campus Ministry at West Liberty University. The meeting was spirit led and we both left feeling uplifted and encouraged about the possibilities of sharing some campus ministry functions within this new Family Life position. After several meetings with various groups within the church, we landed on a revised job description that would include working with youth and families along with college-aged students!

God made a path for kingdom work to continue on The Hilltop as well making room to develop new ministries within the church for children and families. This new position is an amalgamation of possibilities: new opportunities for the church to be in partner-ship with college students; growing ministries within the greater Wheeling area that might include children and young families; and strengthening our desire to be in mission with our community. God planted the seeds long before any of us knew what would happen. Now we need to continue praying and listening to folks around us. What are their hopes and dreams? How can we introduce the community to our live-giving Savior in ways that are filled with love and kindness? How can we develop a greater sense of discipleship?


